Open Educational Resources

Coined at an UNESCO forum in 2002: "The open provision of educational resources, enabled by ICTs for consultation, use and adaptation by a community of users for non-commercial purposes" (UNESCO 2002, p.24)







10 years later...

OER as "[t]eaching, learning and research materials in any medium, digital or otherwise, that reside in the public domain or have been released under an open license that permits no-cost access, use, adaptation and redistribution by others with no or limited restrictions." **UNESCO (2012)**







The 5R Permissions or OERs









What is open education?

A mode of realising education, often enabled by digital technologies, aiming to widen access and participation to everyone by removing barriers and making learning accessible, abundant, and customisable for all. It offers multiple ways of teaching and learning, building and sharing knowledge, as well as a variety of access routes to formal and non-formal education, bridging them.



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
